

The Exterior Fix-Up Grants are Coming!

This year the CCIA is happy to offer **TEN** Homeowners and **THREE** Landlords grants to repair and improve the outside of houses. Condos and Apartment buildings are not included. If you aren't sure, check out the application information at the back of the Newsletter. You can also contact the CCIA Office, 204.806.5939 and either Deborah or Tanya will get back to you.

Just fill out application form and drop it off at the CCIA Community Office, 427 Alexander Avenue. The Deadline for applications is April 8, 2016.



To make it easier for homeowners and landlords, we will be offering a workshop to everyone who sends in an application. The workshop will help everyone with resources, information and choices to improve the exterior of their homes.



Last fall, Tanya and Deborah did a Safety Audit of the neighbourhood and found that many homes have steps and stairs that need to be repaired or replaced; missing or damaged railings; and homes that needed painting or their roofs replaced. All these things can qualify for a **CCIA EXTERIOR FIX-UP GRANT!**

HOMEOWNERS: Apply and receive up to \$2500 toward the costs of the work.

TENANTS: Give the application to your Landlord when you pay your rent! You know what needs to be repaired, and this might help get your landlord to do it!

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THE HABITAT HANDYMAN

Habitat for Humanity Manitoba launched its newest venture, The Habitat Handyman in December of 2015.

By working in the community, it became apparent that there is a lack of services available for those small home repair jobs that most people aren't able to do by themselves and most repair services don't want to be bothered with. Hence the creation of "The Habitat Handyman", a new social enterprise to serve the community while continuing to support the mission of Habitat for Humanity Manitoba.

Under the direction of Jim Gnidziejko, a Red Seal Carpenter with more than 30 years of experience in residential construction. The Habitat Handyman program will operate on a fee for service basis. We will keep the costs in line by tapping into our bank of skilled volunteers to do some of the work and licensed trades people when required. Consequently the Habitat Handyman



will be able to successfully complete a wide range of projects at or below market rates, with the quality of the work assured.

Start-up capital for this enterprise was provided by Jim and Leney Richardson; the Pollard Family Foundation and the Winnipeg Foundation.

Equipment sponsorship was provided by ComFree, a proud community partner.

- That Habitat for Humanity has been serving families in Manitoba, by providing affordable housing for almost 30 years? *To date, we have helped 346 low income families achieve homeownership through our program of no down payment, no interest and mortgage geared to income program.*
- That the ReStore is part of Habitat for Humanity and has been operating in Manitoba for 25 years? The concept of a ReStore was developed right here in Winnipeg as a venue to recycle new and gently used items for your home for sale at a discounted rate. The profits from the ReStore go directly into the homebuilding program of Habitat for Humanity. This program is so successful and has expanded to the point where there are now 92 ReStores across Canada and over 900 throughout the United States, and the program is continuing to expand around the world, wherever there are Habitat Affiliates. Around the Neighbourhood

Miracle Store and More ...Winnipeg Inner City Missions

The Miracle Store at the Anishinabe Fellowship Center has been in operation for at least 15 years. "It's community helping community," says ED Reverend Margret Mullin. What started out as a thrift store now also has a work experience program built in where volunteers can amp up their resume and build job skills. Often called the "25 Cent Store" the Miracle Store is only one of many programs run by Inner City Missions. Donations of clothing, books, games, toys, and household goods are accepted Monday – Thursday 9am - 3pm. People interested in the volunteer program are encouraged to apply in person to the store at 287 Laura Street.



In the same building at 287 Laura Street, the Anishinabe Fellowship Center hosts the "Learning to Play Program" on Tuesdays at 1pm - 3pm. Open to the public, children ages 1-5 and their caregivers are encouraged to come by and have a fun and educational time of learning concepts and early literacy.

You may have wondered what is happening at the apartment block on the corner of Ellen and 415 Logan. This is another project of Winnipeg Inner City Missions called "Place of Hope." They provide subsidized housing and professional support for people ages 30 – 50 who are underemployed or have been on long term unemployment. They have a full time social worker on staff to assist tenants to develop an employment and career plan. There is a total sobriety policy in the nineteen suite building with a maximum stay of three years. Last but not least the Winnipeg Inner City Missions offers up a Sunday Church Service at 3:30pm at the "Place of Hope Presbyterian Church" with a fellowship hour afterward with hot soup to top it off.



2016/2017 Centennial and North Logan Neighbourhoods External Fix-Up Grants

Centennial Neighborhood Housing Plan (2014-2019): A Neighborhood Housing Plan is a way for residents to come together to create a vision for housing in their Neighborhood, and then agree on the goals and action steps to move towards the vision of the Residents of Centennial and North Logan "A safe, walkable, socially active community with affordable, diverse, and well-maintained housing"

Centennial Community Improvement Association (CCIA): We are a group of residents and stakeholders committed to making our community a better place for our families and community since 2003. In that time, we have strived to create partnerships with all levels of government and various agencies that will benefit Centennial and North Logan Neighbourhoods. Actually, CCIA is administering the **External Fix-up Grants** with funding of the City of Winnipeg- Housing Development Division, 2014.

External Fix-Up Grant Applications: Program oriented to homeowners and landlords to "Improve safety in Centennial and North Logan. This Program is available with funding from the government to solve some need identified by the residents to improve their housing conditions. **Activities considered for the Grant are Upgrade infrastructure and housing exteriors** and it is only for **houses** occupied by a homeowner or a tenant. **Apartment Building and Condos are NOT eligible.** The property (house) must be located in **CENTENNIAL or NORTH LOGAN Neighbourhoods.**

Resident- Homeowner Category: Is a primary resident-owner of the address on the application. Under this category, the property cannot be used for commercial purposes (rental or registered home business). **The maximum grant is up to \$2,500.** Based on the project cost the homeowner must contribute with at least the 10%.

<u>Landlord Category:</u> A Landlord' is a person who operates a self-contained rental unit on their property. Landlords must match the amount of the grant allocated to them dollar-per-dollar. **The maximum grant awarded to this category is up to \$5000.** Landlords can enter more than one property in the draw, but will only receive one non-transferable grant allocation (Ex: if two properties of the same landlord are drawn; only one of them will be allocated a grant.
